CEREBRAL PALSY OF COLORADO'S 23RD ANNUAL EXOTIC SPORTS CAR SHOW ATTRACTS 8,000 ATTENDEES

Denver, CO (June 15, 2006): The 23rd Annual Exotic Car Show & Concours D'Elegance was a huge success with attendance at the event topping 8,000 people and raising over \$73,500! Adults and children alike marveled at over 320 cars worth over 22 Million Dollars that were on display. The car show, which first debuted in 1983, benefits Cerebral Palsy of Colorado's Creative Options Early Education Programs. The show was held Sunday, June 4, 2006 at the Arapahoe Community College, in Littleton, Colorado.

Creative Options offers its families the tools that will allow them to thrive as citizens. Creative Options Centers for Early Education provided early care, intervention, prevention, support and education services to expectant mothers and to 700 infants, toddlers and pre-school children and their families at six metro area centers in the last year.

As a result:

Through a collaborative effort with a public school, teen parents learned about their children's development as well as developing their own life skills.

100% of the children enrolled in our programs were screened for developmental and health concerns resulting in a decrease of need for special education.

90% of the children preparing for kindergarten demonstrated proficiency in language development and developmentally appropriate social/ emotional behaviors.

Over 60% of our families attended parent nights, parent trainings and volunteered at the centers

Family interviews and surveys show the parents of the children at Creative Options Early Education Centers felt respected and felt they were considered partners in the development of their child's educational goals.
