Inaugural Straight Shot Sporting Clay Shoot is a smashing success for Cerebral Palsy of Colorado!

DENVER, CO – September 25, 2006: \$106,000 was raised at Cerebral Palsy of Colorado's Inaugural Straight Shot Sporting Clay Tournament. The event held at Kiowa Creek Sporting Club was a benefit in part for the Infantile Scoliosis Outreach Program, one of several CP of Colorado's programs. Two hundred and thirty two shooters registered for the event and over 95 sponsors and contributors came together making this benefit the largest of it's kind in Colorado!

The day was similar in format to a golf tournament. Presented by Southwestern Investments, Inc. the tournament included morning and afternoon flights in order to accommodate all the shooters. Teams consisted of four shooters who worked their way through one of the country's finest sporting clay courses, Kiowa Creek. Halliburton graciously prepared and donated lunch for the benefit. This being the second time they have done so at a Cerebral Palsy of Colorado benefit.

An auction between flights raised additional funds. A variety of individuals graced the audience including two Colorado Clay Shooting Champions. Previous State Champion, Mr. Warren Watson; who also served on the event steering committee and 2006 State Champion Mr. Dan Callahan. Additionally, one very special guest Dr. Min Mehta was in attendance. Dr. Mehta from London is in town sharing her considerable expertise and techniques with American orthopaedic surgeons, pediatricians, and other medical professionals through the Early Treatment Trial Project, a one-of-a-kind program that was initiated by Cerebral Palsy of Colorado's Infantile Scoliosis Outreach Program.
